The independent auditor's report on financial results of these entities have been furnished to us by the management and our opinion on the consolidated annual financial results, in so far as it relates to the amounts and disclosures included in respect of these entities, is based solely on the report of such auditors and the procedures performed by us are stated in paragraph above.

The consolidated annual financial results include the audited financial results of one associate included in the Statement, whose share of net profit/(loss) (before consolidation adjustment) for the year ended 31 March, 2024 included in these financial results is INR (101.59) lakhs. The financial statements have been audited by other auditors whose audit reports have been furnished to us by the Holding Company's Management and our report on the Statement, in so far as it relates to the amounts and disclosures included in respect of this associate, is based solely on the reports of the other auditors and the procedures performed by us, as stated above.

According to the information and explanations given to us by the Management, this financial result is not material to the Group.
